PHE (Public Health Emergency)

The federal Public Health Emergency (PHE) declaration was renewed for 90 days effective February 11, 2023, and expiring May 11, 2023.

Secretary of Health and Human Services Xavier Becerra has notified states that <u>the Public Health</u> <u>Emergency will not be extended beyond 5/11/2023.</u>

Service Authorizations:

Services provided between July 1, 2022, and May 11, 2023 (SFY2023) will not be counted toward state fiscal year limit caps. No service authorizations will be required for services provided between those dates.

Important dates:

- Service authorizations will be required beginning May 12, 2023.
- State Fiscal Year limits will be reset May 12, 2023.
- State Fiscal Year limits will reset July 1, 2023 (in the new fiscal year).

H0015 Intensive Outpatient Services: The New Way of Doing Old Business

Prior to the implementation of the 1115 Waiver, participants needing the higher level of care offered through Intensive Outpatient Services (IOP) often had their treatment addressed through a variety of medically necessary outpatient services including the use of H2015 Comprehensive Community Support Services (CCSS). While these important skill-building, counseling, and relapse prevention offerings helped people in individual and group settings achieve a frequency of engagement needed for their well-being, no true IOP program existed under the State Plan.

Enter the Waiver and exit Comprehensive Community Support Services.

In both the 1115 Behavioral Health and 1115 Substance Use Disorder Standards and Administrative Procedures manuals, H0015 (and its modifiers) is now a billable code for Intensive Outpatient Services. Designed for participants experiencing significant functional impairments interfering with their ability to participate in one or more life domains, IOP allows providers to bill one service for people needing 9-19 hours of treatment per week. This not only mitigates the need to bill several service codes, but also ensures people are enrolled in the right levels of care. And while H2021 Community Recovery Support Services (CRSS) mirrors many of the interventions that existed under CCSS, providers do not need to replicate the same dependence on CRSS to get participants the frequency and level of care needed.

As you think about your treatment programs and intentions you may have to expand into IOP, look at how many different services within your outpatient program you are offering to the same person each week and consider whether you have the capacity to shift to IOP.

Service Authorization Preparedness.

In February, Optum launched Pre-Launch Service Authorization Testing. Optum worked with Providers to test the end-to-end service authorization process. Twenty-six (26) Providers were involved submitting a SA online and via fax. Optum conducted several individual provider trainings weekly through to March 03, 2023. Testing allowed Optum to reduce potential system corrections and allowed providers hands on practice. The PHE (Public Health Emergency) is coming to an end May 12, 2023. Optum appreciates the participation, feedback, and conversations to better prepare for our Go Live of Service Authorizations.

Procedure / Modifier Grids Are Available

Entering procedure modifiers in the correct sequence is necessary for accurate claim payment. Entering procedure code modifiers in any other order may result in claims denials, underpayments and/or overpayments.
